

West Auckland District Pony Club Inc - Membership Application Form 1 September 2010 to 31 August 2011

MEMBERSHIP: Any person who wishes to become a member of the Massey Pony Club as a branch of the West Auckland District pony Club must apply in writing on the official form approved by the branch and all the particulars required therein must be properly and correctly completed. ALL applications must be signed by the senior member applying or a parent or guardian of the junior member applying. **JUNIOR MEMBERS** (under 17 years) are not entitled to exercise the power of voting, therefore it is required that the parent/guardian of a junior member become a financial member which entitles them to voting rights.

DOGS: There are to be NO DOGS at rallies, events, camps & holiday programmes, training clinics and or organised events. Dogs are to be kept on leads around the clubhouse at all times. Dogs are not permitted in the arena at any time.

SMOKING: Massey Pony Club supports a SMOKE FREE POLICY. There is to be no smoking around the clubhouse. No smoking around pens or groups of riders. Please find an area which will not affect others. Thank you

WORKING BEE REQUIREMENTS

Everyone on the committee that is running the pony club is a volunteer. To run a great club takes a great deal of time, we all need to work together and we ask you to fill in the following form for this reason. We understand that in today's world we are all too busy! Just remember the old saying "Many hands make light work" and let's have a great season working and playing together. Working bee days are those required for preparation of our events. Helping on an event day is an expectation of each and every club member and does not count as a working bee day. If you cannot attend a working bee you should contact a member of the committee who can allocate a job for you to do at a time that suits. 'Events' listed below include ODE's, Ribbon Days, and other organised Events.

PRE EVENT JOBS :

- 1 CLUBHOUSE – cleanup inside, outside and around Clubhouse – cleaning, weedeating, setting up interior
- 2 OLD CLUBHOUSE – cleaning up and setting up for scorers etc
- 3 PAPERWORK – getting ready all paperwork for judges and scorers, getting clipboards & pens etc
- 4 SHOWJUMPING – setting up showjumping rings , labelling and decorating
- 5 CROSS COUNTRY – work needs to be done over a period of time in advance of the event – weedeating, mowing, painting, trimming trees, clearing ditches, repairing jumps, cleaning the waterjump etc.

The working bee before the event – brushing and decorating, ground poles, numbering and flagging.

- 6 DRESSAGE – set up Dressage arenas, dismantle + put away if required on day etc
- 7 RIBBON DAYS / DERBY DAYS / SHOWCROSSE DAYS – setting up rings
- 8 GENERAL GROUNDS – mowing and tidying up, weedeating, clearing up rubbish, rubbish to tip, repairs etc

EVENT DAY JOBS – these are NOT counted as working bees

- 1 DRESSAGE – writers , runners, team to dismantle and put away the dressage arenas
- 2 SHOWJUMPING – writers, timekeepers, gate stewards, pole replacers – for each ring
- 3 CROSS COUNTRY – timekeepers, start & finishers, jump judges for each jump for each level, remove flags & numbers at end of day, return plants to nursery etc
- 4 GEAR CHECKERS – need at least 4 in the morning
- 5 ENTRIES – checking off entries and giving out back numbers, collecting any unpaid entry fees etc
- 5 GENERAL – scorers, helpers in the Canteen, cleanup at end of day, parking attendants x 3 minimum at main gate and reserve

We also need lots of volunteers who are able to provide specialist skills to support the club. If you have any of the following equipment or skills and are happy to share them with us please let us know

EQUIPMENT:

- 1 SPECIALIST EQUIPMENT / TOOLS – mowers – rider on or push, weed eaters, chainsaws, 4WD motorbike, fencing equipment
- 2 SPECIALIST SKILLS – electrician, carpenter, arborist, plumber, legal, accounting, fund raising, web design etc etc
- 3 CANTEEN – baking – baking is required for each event (and a Tuesday night rally) – all baking gratefully accepted

Special Help list

7. WORKING BEE AGREEMENT

I/We agree to attend a minimum of **8 working bees** and to help at events which will be rostered (if this is not fulfilled a family levy of \$200 prorated by the number of working bees missed will be charged to your enrolment fee the subsequent season and the committee of Massey Pony Club may choose to decline your membership). If unable to attend W/B's you will be required to pay this levy in advance at enrolment.

When you are rostered to a job for the season it is your responsibility to ensure that someone is there on the day fulfilling the requirements of the job. Responsibilities of the event days are of utmost importance to the club and we cannot carry members who are not prepared to fulfil the requirements of the club. It is most important that our event days are well patronised by our own members and that we have sufficient members to run these days. It is the money from these events that enable us to keep up the high standard of instruction and equipment that we have. It is one way we have of fund raising for the year and it is with these funds that we keep our club actively improving

We also ask that you agree to abide by the Massey Pony Club code of conduct including our conflict resolution policy.
